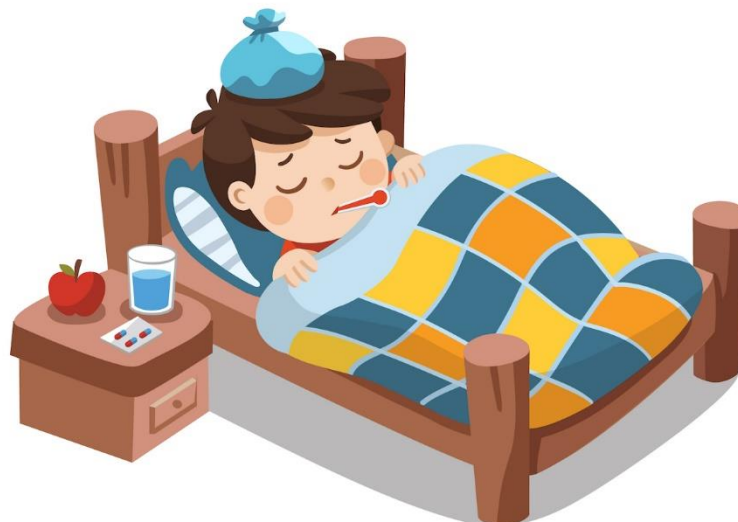

B: I'll give you some medicine.


You'll get better now.
